Dear Judge Wolfson,

Again, We the people, plaintiffs respectfully request this Honorable Court sign the pending Temporary Restraining Order (TRO) that was presented to this Court on October 1, 2010 without further delay. The TRO was served on the Defendants unsigned as the Court requested, which is not normal procedure for any Court regarding TROs. The TRO needs to be signed to stop the harm that this unconstitutional bill is causing.

As Your Honor must know today Federal Judge Roger Vinson signed an Order stating that the Healthcare Petitions before his Federal Court instituted by the 20 State attorneys General will go forth and proceed with oral argument. Your Honor is also aware that the Petition before this District Court, notwithstanding the same arguments that will proceed to trial in Judge Vinson's court, specifically demonstrates and enumerates no less than fourteen (14) specific additional violations of the United States Constitution. Yet this Court has failed to act. Nor has this Court given any legal reason, or in fact any reason, for not following normal Court procedures and signing the TRO on the day it was presented to this Court.

It must also be noted defendants have yet to acknowledged either the petition or the TRO that the Court mandated be served unsigned. It is our understanding, as pro se, nowhere does the law allow a TRO to be set aside without explicit legal justification and explanation. Nor is a Court allowed, to our knowledge, to refuse signing a TRO without hearing arguments before a Justice to explain the legal reasoning for refusing to sign a TRO.
